Flying Geese fall into formation in this dynamic design. Two easy blocks allow this quilt to stitch up quickly, and our *Flight Pattern* fabrics add sky-high fun!



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
TAKE FLIGHT QUILT PATTERN

Materials and Cutting		
Fabric	Yardage	Cutting
 Up in the Air Stella-1115 Twilight	1 ¹ / ₄ yards	Cut: 6 strips, 3" x width of fabric (WOF). Sub-cut 72 A squares, 3" x 3". 2 strips, 1 ³ / ₄ " x WOF. Sub-cut 18 E rectangles, 1 ³ / ₄ " x 3". 1 strip, 6 ¹ / ₄ " x WOF. Sub-cut 1 square, 6 ¹ / ₄ " x 6 ¹ / ₄ ". Cut the square once diagonally to make 2 corner triangles. 1 strip, 12" x WOF. Sub-cut 2 squares, 12" x 12". Cut the squares twice diagonally to make 8 side triangles. There will be three extra triangles.
 On Cloud Nine Stella-1117 White	7/8 yards	Cut: 2 strips, 3" x WOF. Sub-cut 9 C rectangles, 3" x 5 ¹ / ₂ ". 4 strips, 5" x WOF. Sub-cut 16 G rectangles, 5" x 8".
 In Flight Stella-1118 Twilight	1/2 yard	Cut: 7 strips, 2" x WOF. Sub-cut 32 F rectangles, 2" x 8".
 Triangles Stella-1119 Mystic	3/8 yard	Cut: 4 strips, 2 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF, for binding.
 Flight Pattern Stella-1116 Methyl	1/4 yard	Cut: 2 strips, 3" x WOF. Sub-cut 9 B rectangles, 3" x 5 ¹ / ₂ ".
 Triangles Stella-1119 Scuba	1/4 yard	Cut: 2 strips, 3" x WOF. Sub-cut 9 D rectangles, 3" x 5 ¹ / ₂ ".
 In Flight Stella-1118 White	1 ¹ / ₂ yards	Backing
Other		
Batting	40" x 51"	

Note: All seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise specified. Press seam allowances open unless otherwise indicated.


Make the A Blocks

1 Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of 27 **A** squares. Place one marked square right sides together with a **B** rectangle



as shown. Sew on the drawn line. Press back towards the corner to form a triangle. Trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Fold the triangle to the right side. Press the seam allowances toward the triangle.

2 Place a second marked **A** square right sides together on the opposite end of the **B** rectangle as shown. Sew on the marked line. Trim and press as in step 1. Trim the unit to 3" x 5". Make a total of 9 Flying Geese A/B units.

3 Repeat steps 1 and 2 using marked **A** squares and **C** rectangles to make 9 Flying Geese A/C units.

4 Repeat steps 1 and 2 using marked **A** squares and **D** rectangles to make 9 Flying Geese A/D units.




Flying Geese A/D Unit

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
- 5 Sew one **A** square to the left end of each **A/B** unit.
- 6 Sew one **E** rectangle to each end of each **A/C** unit.
- 7 Sew one **A** square to the right end of each **A/D** unit.
- 8 Arrange one **A/B**, **A/C**, and **A/D** unit as shown. Join the units together along adjacent edges. Trim the block to 7 1/2" square. Make a total of nine A blocks.

Make the B Blocks

- 1 Sew one **F** rectangle to each side of one **G** rectangle. Trim the block to 7 1/2" square. Make a total of sixteen B Blocks.



- ### Quilt Top Assembly
- 1 Referring to the Quilt Assembly Diagram, arrange the A and B Blocks, side triangles and corner triangles in eight diagonal rows. Sew the elements in each row together along adjacent edges. Press the seam allowances in alternate directions for adjacent rows.
 - 2 Trim the excess fabrics from B blocks even with the outer edges of the quilt top.

Finishing

- 1 Remove the selvages from the backing fabric. Layer the backing, batting, and quilt top. Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Stitch around the perimeter of the quilt, a scant 1/4" from the outer edge. Trim the excess batting and backing. Use your favorite method to bind the quilt.
