# ROSE HEDGE QUILT PATTERN

Materials and Cutting			
Fabric	Yardage	Cutting	
	Hedgehogs Stella-SRR859 White	1 3/8 yards	Cut: 13 strips, 3 1/2" x width-of-fabric (WOF). Sub-cut 20 <b>C</b> rectangles, 3 1/2" x 6 1/2", and 100 <b>D</b> squares, 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" for blocks.
	Blooming Garden Stella-SRR858 White	1 1/4 yards	Cut: 7 strips, 5 1/2" x width of fabric for outer borders.
	Garden Sanctuary Stella-SRR857 Eden	3/4 yard	From <i>each</i> fabric, cut: 6 strips, 3 1/2" x WOF. Sub-cut 10 <b>A</b> rectangles, 3 1/2" x 12 1/2", and 10 <b>B</b> rectangles, 3 1/2" x 9 1/2" for blocks.
	Vines Stella-SRR674 Pasture	3/4 yard	
	Foxglove Stella-SRR860 Blackberry	5/8 yard	From <i>each</i> fabric, cut: 5 strips, 3 1/2" x WOF. Sub-cut 10 <b>E</b> rectangles, 3 1/2" x 9 1/2" and 10 <b>F</b> rectangles, 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" for blocks.
	Vines Stella-SRR674 Pansy	5/8 yard	
	Scallop Dot Stella-SRR512 Purple	5/8 yard	Cut: 1 strip, 3 1/2" x WOF. Sub-cut 10 <b>H</b> squares, 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" for blocks. 7 strips, 2 1/4" x WOF, for binding
	Garden Sanctuary Stella-SRR857 Vapor	1/2 yard	Cut: 6 strips, 2 1/2" x WOF, for inner border.
	Scallop Dot Stella-SRR512 Lilac	1/8 yard	Cut: 1 strip, 3 1/2" x WOF. Sub-cut 10 <b>G</b> squares, 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" for blocks.
	Tools Stella-SRR862 White	4 yards	Backing
Other			
Batting	70" x 82"		

Note: All seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise specified. Press seam allowances open unless otherwise indicated.

## Make the Blocks

① Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of 80 **D** squares.

② Place a marked **D** square right sides together on one end of a **F** rectangle as shown below. Sew on the marked line. Trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Fold the corner triangle to the right side. Press the seam toward the triangle. Repeat, using a **B** rectangle in place of the **F** rectangle. Make a total of 20 **F** units and 20 **B** units.




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# ROSE HEDGE QUILT PATTERN


**③** Place a marked **D** square right sides together on one end of an **E** rectangle as shown below. Sew on the marked line. Trim the excess corner fabric, leaving a  $1/4"$  seam allowance. Fold the corner triangle to the right side. Press the seam toward the triangle. Repeat, using an **A** rectangle in place of the **E** rectangle. Make a total of 20 **E** units and 20 **A** units.



**④** Sew one of the remaining **D** squares to one side of each **G** and **H** square, as shown. Press the seam toward the **G** and **H** squares. Join a **C** rectangle to one edge of each **D/G** or **D/H** unit. Press the seam open.



**⑤** Referring to the quilt photo for fabric placements, arrange one unit from step 4, matching **A** and **B** units, and matching **E** and **F** units as shown. Sew the units to the step 4 unit in this order: **F, E, B, A**. Press the seams open. If necessary, trim and square the block to  $12\frac{1}{2}" \times 12\frac{1}{2}"$ . Make a total of 20 Rose blocks.



## Assemble the Quilt

**①** Referring to the quilt photo, arrange the Rose blocks in 5 rows of 4 blocks each. Note the fabric placement and orientation of alternate blocks. Join the blocks in each row together along adjacent edges. Press the seams in each row in alternate directions. Join the rows together, matching seams. Press the seams in one direction.

**②** Join the inner border strips together end to end, using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Cut two strips,  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 60\frac{1}{2}"$  for inner side borders, and two strips,  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 52\frac{1}{2}"$  for inner top/bottom borders.

**③** Join one inner side border to each long edge of the quilt center. Press the seams toward the borders. Join one inner top/bottom border to the top and one inner top/bottom border to the bottom of the quilt. Press the seams toward the borders.

**④** Join the outer border strips together end to end, using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Cut two strips,  $5\frac{1}{2}" \times 64\frac{1}{2}"$  for outer side borders, and two strips,  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 62\frac{1}{2}"$  for outer top/bottom borders.

**⑤** Repeat step 3, using the outer border strips, to complete the quilt top.

## Finishing

**①** Remove the selvages from the backing fabric, then cut the yardage into two equal lengths. Join the pieces together along one long edge, using a  $1/2"$  seam allowance, to make a quilt backing with a horizontal seam. Press the seam open.

**②** Layer the quilt backing, batting and quilt top. Quilt as desired. Stitch around the perimeter of the quilt, a scant  $1/4"$  from the edge. Trim the excess fabric and batting. Use your favorite method to bind the quilt.
